

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE ACADEMIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE (UG)

- I. The UET shall be conducted by the Controller of Exam. by the end of May, and the result be communicated to the Deans of concerned Faculties by first week of June.
- II. All UG admissions shall be completed by June 25.
- III. Academic year shall start from first working day in the month of July in all the faculties (this will enable students to offer courses across the faculties).
- IV. There shall be a common orientation programme of all newly admitted UG students in the university just after admissions are over in the respective faculties.
- V. The Honours subject of a candidate shall be decided on the basis of his UET rank at the time of admission. However, allocation for the available/vacant seats in an Honours subject may be done after the end of II Semester on the basis of CGPA of the student of First year.

PROPOSED CREDIT AND COURSE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DEGREE OF UG (Hons.)

1	RESIDENTIAL REQUIREMENT
	Minimum residential requirement for completion of UG (Hons.) course shall be six (6) semesters, extendable to a maximum of twelve (12) semesters in total.
2	CREDIT REQUIREMENT
	In order to qualify for the UG (Hons.) degree a student shall be required to complete a minimum of 120 credits.
3	A UG (Hons.) student shall offer, in each semester, a credit load as prescribed in these ordinances vide Tables 1,2,3 and 4.
	A. COMPULSORY COURSES
	A student shall be required to offer three types of courses for completing the credit requirements for the UG (Hons.) degree:
	1. Honours subject[‡] , e.g., <i>Zoology for B. Sc (Hon.) Zoology degree</i> : (70 credits minimum) <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Core courses (20credits minimum to a maximum of 30 credits) (b) Elective courses or Optional courses (70 - credits of Core courses)
	2. Supporting subjects or Subsidiary subjects : [Two. e.g., <i>Botany & Chemistry for B. Sc. (Hons.) Zoology</i>]: 40 credits minimum (15 + 15 credits minimum in each subject)
	3. Foundation Courses (10 credits minimum)
	B. ADDITIONAL COURSES*
	1. Experiential learning/ innovative Project work : 3 credits in one semester
	2. Summer Training : Interested students may be encouraged to go for training in reputed public/private sectors (recognized by the competent body) during summer break for period not less than 28 days. At the end on submission of Certificate for successful completion of the training to the Controller of Exams. through the Dean of the Concerned faculty, the student may be given a weightage of 3 Credits and details of training and Credits should be mentioned in the final transcript of the student.

‡A faculty where Honours and Supporting courses are to be offered in the same subject they will formulate courses as:

1. Honours subject (110 credits)
 - (a) Core courses (20 credits minimum to a maximum of 30 credits)
 - (b) Elective courses or Optional courses (110 - Credits of Core courses)
2. Foundation Courses (10 credits minimum)

*A student may or may not offer these courses and the credits earned shall not be counted in the total credits required for the completion of the degree.

6	MID-SEMESTER EXAMINATION		
	The mid-semester examination shall be of one hour duration and shall generally cover 50 per cent of the total course.		
7	END-SEMESTER EXAMINATION		
	This examination covering the entire subject matter of a course shall be held at the end of each semester. The duration of the examination shall be of 2 to 3 hrs.		
8	SUBMISSION OF GRADE		
	The Grades shall be sent to the Dean of the Faculty concerned and to the Controller of Exams. within 10 days of the conduct of the examinations.		

	PROMOTION FROM TO NEXT SEMESTER/ACADEMIC YEAR	
	Promotion list shall be prepared at the Faculty level, Accordingly student be promoted to the next semester/academic year. However, final result shall be declared by the Controller of Examination.

	The examinations conducted throughout the semester shall be evaluated in numerals assigning 100 marks to each course. The numerical rating shall be converted to ten point system by placing a decimal before the last digit called here-in-after "grade"
